- 1. Read John 13:18-38.
- 2. How does Jesus' command in verse 34 connect to what He did in John 13:1-17?
- 3. Look over your message notes. What was surprising or insightful? What questions were raised?
- 4. If time allows, look ahead at the "Digging In" section and think through how you would contribute to your group discussion.

FOR STARTERS | THOUGHTS TO GET US ON THE SAME PAGE

- 1. How many movies can you think of where there's a shocking betrayal? (If you're stumped, <u>google</u> <u>can help</u>).
- 2. Go around the group: what words or phrases pop into your mind when you think of Jesus' command to "love one another"?

DIGGING IN | DISCOVERING WHAT GOD SAYS IN SCRIPTURE

- 1. Loving One Another Well
 - a. In this passage Jesus commands His followers to love one another. Read the passages below and talk about what Christian love looks like...
 - ...emotionally (Romans 12:15, 1 Corinthians 13:4-7)
 - ...practically (Acts 4:32, Romans 12:13)
 - ...spiritually (Galatians 6:1, James 5:16)
 - ...in dealing with conflict (Ephesians 4:25-32, 2 Timothy 2:22-23)
 - ...in honoring minorities (1 Corinthians 12:23-26, James 2:1-9)

- b. How have you seen Jesus' love lived out by people in your group? Take some time to affirm and encourage one another.
- c. How does love within the church affect those outside the church according to Jesus in John 13:34–35? Does anyone have an example of what this process looks like in real life? Share it with the group.
- 2. Love When There's Betrayal
 - a. Read Psalm 41:9; 55:12-14 and Matthew 10:21.
 - b. According to these passages, what should Christians expect when it comes to betrayal?
 - c. Read Psalm 89:33, 118:8 and Jeremiah 17:5-8. How does God's faithfulness help us respond to those who betray us?
 - d. How does the fact that Jesus experienced the betrayal of a friend comfort and strengthen you in your own story of betrayal?

- 1. Who is hard to love right now? What would it look like to move toward them with the sincere love of Jesus?
